

ST. MELYD GOLF CLUB LIMITED

RULES

1. Cancellation

All previous rules are hereby cancelled.

2. Name

The name of the Club shall be “St. Melyd Golf Club”.

3. Objects

St Melyd Golf Club is a members’ club, run by the members for the members. The objects of the club shall be to promote and provide facilities for the Amateur Game of Golf in Meliden, Prestatyn and the environs and community benefit in the same and for the participation of the members and for social activities connected therewith including the supply of refreshments and all things incidental to the paying of golf.

It is the club’s policy to support the principle and practice of equality of opportunity. No member, visitor, guest, participant, volunteer, job applicant or employee will receive less favourable treatment on the grounds of his or her sex, disability, race, colour, ethnic origin, nationality, national origin, religion or belief, sexual orientation, gender reassignment, marital or civil partnership status, age and/or disability or will be disadvantaged by conditions or requirements that cannot be shown to be relevant to performance.

Unlawful discriminatory conduct including racial or sexual harassment in contravention of this policy will be regarded seriously and will constitute a **DISCIPLINARY OFFENCE** that will be investigated and thereafter dealt with as appropriate under the terms of the disciplinary procedure.

Sexual harassment of any kind will not be tolerated.

The Club has a grievance procedure including arrangement for appeals against decisions considered unfair. Any member wishing to complain of any alleged discrimination in matters concerning his or her membership is encouraged therefore to invoke the grievance procedure.

The property and funds of the Club cannot be used for the direct or indirect benefit of members other than reasonably allowed under the Rules and all surplus income or profits shall be applied solely towards the promotion of the Objects of the Club.

The Club may provide sporting and related social facilities, sporting equipment, coaching, courses, insurance cover, first aid treatment, away-match expenses, post match refreshments and other ordinary benefits of Community Amateur Sports Clubs as provided in the Finance Act 2002.

The Club may also in connection with the sports purpose of the Club:

- a) sell and supply food, drink, related sports clothing and equipment
- b) employ members (though not for playing) and remunerate them for providing goods and services, on fair terms set by Board without the concerned person being present
- c) pay for reasonable hospitality for visiting teams and guests.

In these rules the expression “Full Members of the Club” shall be deemed to include the Gentlemen members and Lady members.

4. Management

The management of the Club shall be vested in the Board of Directors (“the Board”) which shall have control of the finances of the Club including powers to borrow money whether secured or unsecured, powers to engage, control and dismiss the Club servants and all such administrative and disciplinary powers as may be necessary for the proper carrying out of the objects of the Club in accordance with these rules, save the Board shall not dispose of any major Club asset without the authority of a general meeting, nor shall the members of the Board in their capacity as directors of St. Melyd Golf Club Limited dispose of any land or other major asset held by such company nor lease or purchase any land or major asset without the authority of a general meeting of the Club.

The Board will have due regard to the law on disability discrimination and child protection.

5. Board

The Board shall consist of the Club Captain, Club President, Men’s Vice Captain, Immediate Past Club Captain, Men’s or Lady Captain (see later), Lady Vice Captain, Honorary Secretary and Honorary Treasurer, who shall be deemed to be the “Officers” and not more than eight elected members, who shall be the “Councillors”, who shall be elected for two years, shall retire by rotation every year at the Annual General Meeting but shall be eligible for re-election. All members of the Board have the right to vote, the Club Captain shall have a casting vote.

The Honorary Treasurer shall be appointed by the Board in the November meeting to serve for a term of two years following which he may be invited by the Board to serve for another term. The Honorary Secretary shall be appointed annually by the Board in the November meeting. The Board shall have the power to fill vacancies for Board or

Officers until the next Annual General Meeting. Ex-officio members appointed by Board shall not have the right to vote.

The Men's Vice Captain shall be elected annually in a meeting convened in September by the past Men's Captains. This meeting will be chaired by the senior Past Captain. Potential candidates for the position of Vice Captain elect shall be sought prior to the meeting and then proposed and seconded by Past Captains attending the meeting. In the event that more than one candidate is proposed, then the meeting shall deliberate the merits of the candidates before a secret ballot is conducted of the Past Captains. The Men's Captain will be invited to attend, but shall not be entitled to participate in the vote. The Lady Vice Captain shall be elected annually in a meeting convened in September by the past Lady Captains which shall be organised as above.

The Juniors Captain shall be selected by the Club Captain and Juniors Organiser (Chairman). The decision will normally be made in order of seniority taking length of membership into account.

The Club Captain shall be selected through the following process:

- 1) In July, the Club President shall enquire whether the Men's Vice Captain and Lady Vice Captain wish to be considered for the role of Club Captain;
- 2) In the event that both indicate that they wish to be considered, then the decision on who shall be Club Captain will be decided through a postal ballot of the Club's Full Members which shall be concluded no later than 15 September. Should a candidate decline then the other candidate will be formally ratified as Club Captain;
- 3) The candidate who chooses not to stand or is not elected as Club Captain shall be referred to as the Men's or Lady Captain as appropriate.

The appointment of the President shall be governed by Rule 7.

All regulations made by the Board shall be binding on every member until altered by a General Meeting

6. Board Meetings

Meetings of the Board shall be summoned at least once a month excepting August, which shall be suspended if business allows.

In the event of any member of the Board not attending without reasonable cause one meeting in three consecutive monthly Board meetings, such member shall ipso facto cease to be a member of the Board..

7. Presidents and Vice-Presidents

Either one or two Men's Vice Presidents shall be appointed annually in a meeting of the past Men's Captains and shall be eligible for reappointment. These will normally be former Men's Captains selected in order of seniority.

Similarly the two Ladies Vice Presidents will be selected in the same process in a meeting of the past Lady Captains.

A Men's President shall be appointed by the Board to serve for a maximum period for two years, this will normally be the most senior Men's Vice President.

A Ladies President shall be appointed by the Board to serve for a maximum period for two years, this will normally be the most senior Ladies Vice President.

The Club President shall be selected through the following process:

- 1) In July of the final year of the Club President, the current Club President shall enquire whether the senior Men's Vice President and senior Lady Vice President wish to be considered for the role of Club President;
- 2) In the event that both indicate that they wish to be considered, then the decision on who shall be Club President will be decided through postal ballot of the Club's Full Members... should a candidate decline then the other candidate will be formally ratified as Club President;
- 3) The person who chooses not to stand or is not elected as Club President shall be referred to as the Men's or Lady President as appropriate.

8. Officers

- i The Club Captain, Men's/Lady Captain Men's Vice Captain and Lady Vice Captain shall be ex-officio members of all committees;
- ii The Club Captain shall have full control of the play on the course. The Board's decision on points arising not settled by the Rules of Golf shall be final;
- iii The Honorary Treasurer shall keep the accounts of the Club and shall keep in safe custody all pertinent documents and records. He shall make such periodic financial reports as the Board shall require and shall make up the Annual Statement of Accounts and Balance Sheet of the Club to the 31st July in each year, which shall, after audit, be printed and circulated amongst Full Members with the notice of the Annual General Meeting

9. Club Auditors

A suitably qualified person or firm shall be appointed auditor by the members at the Annual General Meeting. In the event of a vacancy occurring during the year the Board shall appoint an auditor. The auditor shall report on the annual accounts and the remuneration shall be fixed by agreement with the Board.

10. Nomination of Councillors

Any two Full Members of the Club of at least two years standing may nominate any Full Member of at least two years standing to serve on the Board. The name of each member so nominated shall be sent in writing so as to reach the Honorary Secretary not less than twenty one days before the Annual General Meeting accompanied by the candidate's written consent to serve if elected. All nominations shall be listed and posted as received in the Clubhouse with the names of the proposer and seconder and such list shall remain there until after the Annual General Meeting.

Balloting lists shall be prepared when the names of the candidates exceed the number of vacancies. If two or more candidates obtain an equal number of votes, a further ballot limited to the names of the candidates obtaining an equal number of votes shall take place at the Annual General Meeting.

11. Annual or Extraordinary General Meeting

- i. The Annual General Meeting shall be held not later than the second week in November. The Golf Club's year shall run from the Annual General Meeting to the subsequent Annual General Meeting which is independent of the financial year.
- ii Notice of the date of an Annual or Extraordinary General Meeting shall be posted in the Clubhouse at least five weeks prior to the meeting and all Full Members shall be notified by post at least seven clear days before the date of the meeting;
- iii The Board may call an Extraordinary General Meeting when any question of urgent importance shall arise and shall be bound to do so on receiving a requisition signed by twenty Full Members of the Club.
- iv Notice of any motion or amendment in respect of the alteration of the rules and bye-laws or any other matter for submission to the Annual General Meeting must duly be proposed and seconded by two Full Members of the Club and sent in writing to the Honorary Secretary at twenty eight days before the date of the meeting and the Honorary Secretary shall forthwith post such notices on the notice board.

As a courtesy to the incoming Club Captain, Full Members wishing to raise items under Any Other Business should do so in writing to the Club Captain not less than seven days before the meeting is held.

- v. Only Full Members shall have the right to vote.

12. Members

A list of the members of the Golf Club will be available for inspection in the Clubhouse.

The list of memberships available will be displayed in the Clubhouse, which may be varied by the Board from time to time.

- i Membership of the Club is open to all the community on application without discrimination on the grounds of ethnicity, nationality, sexual orientation, religious beliefs, sex, age or disability, except as a necessary consequence of the requirements of the sport of golf. However, limitation of membership according to the facilities is allowable on a non-discriminatory basis.

The Club may have different classes of membership and subscription on a non-discriminatory and fair basis. The Club will keep subscriptions at levels that will not pose a significant obstacle to people participating.

Applicants are required to complete an official form of application for membership, which is then to be deposited with the Honorary Secretary along with the relevant entrance fee and subscription (as applicable). All applications for membership must be proposed and seconded by two full Members of the Club of at least two years standing and approved by the simple majority of the Board. Membership will be confirmed on satisfactory receipt of the application form payment of the required entrance fee and subscription and approved by the Board. New members will be invited to attend an introduction meeting with the Board , sub-committee or to a new members meeting in order to become acquainted with the club's rules, practise and other members;

- ii Members transferring from one category of membership to another shall pay the difference, if any, between the original entrance fee and the then current entrance fee paid by him/her. This amount shall be reduced by one quarter for each consecutive year of membership;
- iii A member may at any time giving notice in writing to the Honorary Secretary, resign their membership of the Club but shall continue to be liable for any subscriptions and any other monies due and unpaid to at the date of resignation. Any such member having discharged all their liabilities to the Club and wishing to rejoin may, upon an available vacancy apply for membership under rule 12 (i) and the Board may, at their discretion, excuse the candidate the entrance fee;
- iv If any member shall violate the rules and regulations of the Club or be guilty of any conduct which in the opinion of the Board is injurious to its character or interests they may by letter invite the member to resign from the Club within a time specified in such letter. In default of resignation, the question of expulsion may be considered by the Board within one month of the date on which the member had been invited to resign. The member shall have the right to offer an

explanation to the Board and call witnesses before the Board . If no such explanation is offered or deemed by the Board to be unsatisfactory, the member shall be so informed and shall cease to be a member of the Club forfeiting all rights and claims upon the Club as he/she otherwise would have had as a member. The member concerned shall have the right to apply in writing to the Honorary Secretary within seven days of receipt of such notification to have the matter considered by the Club at an Extraordinary General Meeting. If such a right is exercised, a meeting shall be convened without delay when the member may present their explanation and may call witnesses but may not be legally or otherwise represented by a third party. Thereafter the matter shall be put to the vote and if two thirds of the voting members present shall vote for expulsion he or she shall cease to be a member.

Voting shall be by secret ballot.

If at any time the Board shall be of the opinion that the interests of the club so require they may suspend a member for such period they deem appropriate and such suspension shall take immediate effect.

13. Subscriptions

- i The annual subscriptions for all classes of membership shall be fixed by the Annual General Meeting. Entrance fee (if any) shall be fixed by the Board;
- ii Members' subscriptions become renewable on the first of February in each year. If the subscription or other monies for which any member shall be liable to the Club remain unpaid or arrangements have not been made for payments by agreed instalments by the last day of February in that year, such member shall not be entitled to any benefits of membership until the subscription or other monies have been paid. If the Board think fit it may post the member's name in the Clubhouse and erase the name from the list of members and the member shall thereupon forfeit all rights and interests in the Club without prejudice to their existing liability. No member shall play in any competition, vote at any general meeting if and when the subscription or any monies due shall be in arrears.

14. Visitors

- i Visitors may play on the course at such times and fees as decided by the Board payment to be made in advance to the Professional, the Office Manager, members or bar staff or green keeper and the receipt for the same must be produced at the request of an Official of the Club. On payment of this fee the visitor is considered to have submitted to the Rules of the Club and on these conditions only is entitled to enjoy the advantages of privileges of the Club;
- ii All members (excepting junior and intermediate members) may introduce guests to the privileges of the Clubhouse.

15. Rules

- i The Board is empowered to make, suspend, repeal and amend such rules as they may from time to time consider necessary for the well being of the Club, such rules, repeals and amendments shall be displayed forthwith on the notice board in the Clubhouse and shall have effect as stated until the next Annual General Meeting when the Board shall submit them to the members for ratification or amendment;
- ii The Board shall have authority to originate, delete or amend bye-laws insofar as it is compatible with decisions passed at General Meetings;
- iii The decision of the Board as to the interpretation of any rule, bye-law or regulation of the Club shall be final and binding;
- iv Every member and visitor shall be bound by and submit to the rules and bye-laws of the Club;
- v Any matter not dealt with in the foregoing rules and bye-laws shall be decided by the Board.

16. General

- i All complaints shall be made to the Honorary Secretary in writing;
- ii In no instance shall a servant of the Club be reprimanded by a member of the Club other than an authorised persons
- iii It is the duty of all members to notify the Honorary Secretary of the Club in writing any change of name, address, telephone number or membership status;
- iv The rules of golf as adopted from time to time by the Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St. Andrews shall be followed. The Board may introduce local rules of the Club as it sees fit, such rules to be in accordance with the Rules of Golf;

Any person breaking, damaging, or removing without authority any of the Club's property will be subject to disciplinary action by the Board.

- v Grievance Procedure

It is very important that if you feel dissatisfied with any matters relating to your membership, there should be a means by which such grievance can be aired and an attempt is made at resolution.

Nothing in this procedure is intended to prevent you from informally raising any matter you may wish to raise. Informal discussions can frequently resolve issues without the need for more formal procedures; however, if you wish your grievance to be dealt with more formally and duly recorded and investigated, you must make this clear at the outset.

If the matter cannot, or is not resolved informally, you should:

1. Raise the matter formally and without unreasonable delay with the Honorary Secretary (providing this person is not the subject of the grievance). This should be done in writing setting out fully the nature of the grievance;

A meeting will then be arranged with the appropriate person, you may be accompanied at such meeting by another member of your choosing.

At the meeting you will be encouraged to explain your grievance and how you think it should be resolved. Consideration will be given to adjourning the meeting for any investigation that may be necessary.

Following the meeting the Honorary Secretary will write to you with the decision and this will, where appropriate, set out what action the Club intends to take to resolve the grievance and any right of appeal.

2. If you feel that your grievance has not been satisfactorily resolved, you can appeal without unreasonable delay and any such appeal must be in writing to the Club Captain who will arrange for you to attend a Board Meeting to discuss the matter. At the meeting you will retain the right to be accompanied by another member to assist in presentation. As soon as is reasonably practicable after any such meeting, you will receive a decision in writing. The decision will be final.

17. Licensing

- i The Board will fix the permitted hours for the sale of intoxicating liquor in accordance with the Licensing Act 2003;
- ii The supply of intoxicating liquor for consumption off the premises will only be made to the member in person;
- iii Intoxicating liquor will only be supplied to a person over the age of 18 years;
- iv Subject to any restrictions which from time to time may be imposed by the Board non-members may be admitted to the Clubhouse and may purchase intoxicating liquor for consumption on the premises;
- v No function shall be permitted to which admission may be obtained by payment of money at the door whether for a ticket or otherwise;

- vi The purchase for the Club and the supply by the Club of intoxicating liquor shall be managed by the Board;
- vii No person is to receive at the expense of the Club any commission percentage or similar payment on or with reference to purchases of intoxicating liquor by the Club, nor shall any person derive any pecuniary benefit from the supply of intoxicating liquor by or on behalf of the Club or by or on behalf of the Club members.

18. Dissolution

If at any Extraordinary Annual General Meeting at which not less than 80% of the members eligible to vote are present a resolution for the dissolution of the Club is passed by a majority of two thirds of the members present and voting, the Board must immediately instruct the Trustees to proceed with the orderly winding up of the Club's affairs.

After settling all liabilities of the Club, the Trustees shall dispose of the net assets to one or more of the following as agreed upon by the membership:

1. to another Club with similar sporting purposes which is a registered charity.
2. to the Club's governing body for use by them for related community sports.

In default of such agreement the net assets shall be distributed to such Clubs or sporting bodies as shall be nominated by the Secretary for the time being of the Golf Union of Wales or its successors.

19. Priority

Where there is any conflict between any of the above Rules ("key Rules") and any other rule or rules the key Rule(s) will take priority.

Bye-Laws

1. Membership

- i The Board has the discretion to limit the numbers in any category of membership;
- ii Members will be permitted to transfer to alternative categories provided the limit of that category has not been reached and the Board approves;
- iii No subscriptions or dues are payable by the Club Captain, Men's/Ladies Captain, Junior Captain, Club President and the Men's/Ladies President whilst in office.

2. Honoraria

- i The Club Captain, Honorary Secretary and Honorary Treasurer shall be entitled to receive an honorarium in an amount and in a manner to be determined by the Board;
- ii Bona fide expenses incurred by Officers and Councillors on Club business shall be reimbursed by the Club.

3. Course

- i Green Fee paying visitors must be bona fide members of a recognised golf club or society. The Professional or their accredited representative has authority to request sight of Handicap Certificates or Letters of Introduction and to refuse admission at their discretion. Visiting parties of more than eight will only be accepted by prior arrangement with the Office Manager;
- ii Courtesy of the Course may be extended to the Captains, Lady Captains, Secretaries and Lady Secretaries of recognised Golf Clubs and members of the P.G.A. The Club Captain, Men's/Lady Captain and Honorary Secretary may, in the interests of the Club, grant courtesy of the Course;
- iii Course restrictions shall be determined by the Board and posted on the notice board.

The Club Diary will be agreed at Diary Meeting(s) arranged between the Club Captain, Men's/Lady Captain, Men's Vice Captain, Lady Vice Captain, Men's Match & Handicap Secretary, Lady Match & Handicap Secretary, Juniors Organiser and Honorary Secretary. The draft Club Diary will be proposed and ratified at the November Council meeting. Should any member wish to make a proposal to be reviewed at the Diary Meeting then they should apply in writing to the Honorary Secretary not later than 1 October providing full details of their proposal and any explanatory reasons;

- iv Junior members are not allowed to play the course on Sundays or Bank Holidays before 1300 hours. When playing after 1800 hours and not accompanied by an adult, junior members must give way to adults. Junior members under fourteen years of age will not be allowed to play on the course after 1800 hours unless accompanied by an adult conversant with the Rules and Etiquette of golf, but if possessing an official Club Handicap of 28 or less may play without being accompanied, Junior Competitions being excepted;

- v Practice on the course by an individual playing more than one golf ball is forbidden and no person is permitted more than six golf balls on the practice ground during competition times;
- vi Starting will normally be from the first tee but other starting points may be used provided there is a least one clear hole either way. During competition times non-competitors must start from the first tee and may not do so until the last competitors have commenced the back nine holes and are in at least one clear hole in front;

Caddy cars will only be allowed if fitted with wide wheels and at times permitted by the Board..

Members and Visitors are reminded of the rule for slow play: “A player shall at all times play without undue delay. Between completion of a hole and driving off the next tee a player may not delay in any way. Penalty: Match play loss of hole. Stroke play: 2 strokes. For repeated offence: disqualification”

If a game following is waiting speed up, pick up or call through IMMEDIATELY – do not wait for a queue to form. Players must not play until those in front are out of range. If a ball is inadvertently struck towards another person, the striker or member of that game shall shout FORE! loudly and in good time. After such an incident the player(s) will apologise to those affected at the earliest opportunity. “Players searching for a ball should signal those behind through as soon as it becomes apparent that the ball will not easily be found; they should not search for the lost ball for the statutory 5 minutes before doing so,”. Where possible they should play along with the overtaking players to avoid undue delay to those following. Where the play of two or more games coincides, those playing the later hole have priority. Members are to approach matches holding others up and politely explaining the etiquette of calling through or hurrying up.

The Golf course is surrounded by private properties and highways; no player has any right to enter these areas at any time. Members and Visitors must exercise extreme caution to avoid playing in to neighbouring properties or highways. Players wilfully ignoring this rule will be barred from the club and course and may face civil action.

There is a public footpath running across the course and golfers must ensure any adjacent footpath is clear before playing and give right of way to the walkers at all times.

- vii Dress code – Members are expected to set an example in wearing conventional golf dress on the course and an appropriate standard of dress is strictly required on the course at all times;

Round collars are acceptable provide they have a neck band, tee shirts are not acceptable;

Tailored shorts during the summer season

Shirts must be worn inside trousers

No denims to be worn i.e. jackets, jeans, trousers or skirts

No tracksuits or sports wear

No trainers, track or sports shoes other than golf shoes

No wearing of trousers inside socks unless they are specifically designed for the purpose.

The use of mobile phones is strictly prohibited

4. House and Bar

i Clubhouse

The Clubhouse will be open from 8.00am and will close thirty minutes after bar closing time except on Friday and Saturday when it will be one hour. Smoking is not permitted in any part of the Clubhouse. Junior members under 16 years of age are not permitted into Bars or Lounge whilst the Clubhouse is being used for the supply of alcohol unless accompanied by a person who has attained the age of 18 years, or for the purpose of gaining access to locker rooms or toilet facilities.

In order to protect the interests of Full Members, no functions shall be held on Thursday or Saturdays between 4pm and 7pm without the written permission of the Board.

ii Bar

The opening hours are displayed on a notice in the bar and may be altered by the Board due to seasonal circumstances and when trade requires.

iii Dress Code

An appropriate standard of dress is strictly required in the Clubhouse (including restaurant) at all times:

Round collars are acceptable provided they have a neck band, tee shirts are not acceptable;

Smart Denim trousers can be worn, no cuts, tears or holes;

Smart casual wear can be worn;

Tailored shorts during the summer season;

All shirts must be worn inside trousers;

No trainers, golf shoes, tracksuits or sports wear;

Jackets, shirts with collars and ties are to be worn at selected occasions when the Men's Captain and/or Club Captain is present: Presentation Night, Council Meetings and other occasions as defined by the Captain. Similarly, Ladies shall wear smart evening wear at selected occasions as defined by the Lady Captain and/or Club Captain.

Members are responsible at all times for ensuring our Dress Code is complied with and also for the behaviour and dress of any of their guests.

iv **Gaming Machines**

Members under the age of 18 years are not permitted to use any gaming machines.

v **Personal Cheques**

Cheques of members may be cashed at the bar up to a limit of £50.00

5. General – Golfing Events

i All Club competitions to be organised within the Rules pertaining to the particular competition displayed in the Clubhouse;

ii When entering a competition, members must be fully aware of the commitment they are making and must notify their playing partners in good time of their inability to participate in the event and also arrange for removal of their name from the starting sheet;

iii All cards taken out for completion must be returned into the box provided even if a "No Return";

iv Course Closure the course shall only be closed when, in the opinion of the greenkeeper along with either the Club Captain or Greens Chairman, play on the course would be impracticable or harmful to the course.

6. Green Fees

The Board shall from time to time determine the amount to be charged to visitors to play on the course. Such fees shall be displayed in a prominent position. Concessionary rates for visitors playing with a member are limited to six times in a twelve month period.

7. Animals

Animals shall not in any circumstances be allowed in the Clubhouse or on the course, unless the animal is a guide dog.

8. Disclaimer

The Club, its agents or employees will not be responsible for any damage injury or loss occurring at the Club or on neighbouring properties or highways or at any activity or function operated, arranged, organised or sponsored by the Club other than death or personal injury caused by the negligence of the Club, its agents or employees.

Any member, guest, visitor or other person who in any manner makes use of any apparatus, facility, privilege or service of the Club or who engages in any game, exercise, competition or any other activity operated, arranged, organised or sponsored by the Club will do so at his/her own risk and will hold the Club, its owners, agent or employees harmless against any loss, costs, injury, damage or any other liability sustained and/or resulting from any act or omission of any Member, guest, visitor or other person introduced into the Club or any visitor except as specified above.

The Club, its agents or employees is not responsible to any Member or their guest or any visitor or any other person loss of articles and effects by fire, theft or any other cause and members are advised to arrange their own insurance cover for the above and the risk involved when using the Club and its facilities.

The Club shall indemnify the Board and the members acting properly in the course of the running of the Club against any liability incurred in the proper running of the Club (but only to the extent of its assets).

9. Social Events

When names are appended on a list to participate in any club social event members must be fully aware of the commitment they are making for themselves and their guests and will be held responsible for payment of a fee in the event of late cancellations.
